To take care of the training needs of the frontline workers, the Government of India launched a training module for the management of COVID-19 named 'Integrated Govt. Online training' (iGOT) portal on the Ministry of HRD's DIKSHA platform for the capacity building of frontline workers to handle the pandemic efficiently.

Courses on iGOT had been launched for Doctors, Nurses, Paramedics, Hygiene Workers, Technicians, Auxiliary Nursing Midwives (ANMs), State Government Officers, Civil Defense Officers, Various Police Organisations, National Cadet Corps (NCC), Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan (NYKS), **National Service Scheme**, Indian Red Cross Society, Bharat Scouts and Guides and other volunteers.

The training contents of the course included Basics of COVID, clinical management, ICU care management, infection prevention and care, usage of PPE, quarantine and isolation, training for NCC cadets, management of COVID-19 cases, laboratory sample collection and testing, psychological care of patients, pediatric care in COVID, pregnancy during COVID, etc. The platform provided the training module on a flextime and on-site basis so that the COVID response could be delivered at scale for the workforce needed to tackle the pandemic.

In April 2020, 15 NSS volunteers of the college registered for the Online Covid Prevention Training given by The Department of Personnel and Training, Govt. of India for all frontline workers in combating the COVID-19 pandemic. Namitha M. Sharma of BSc Mathematics received the certificate after the completion of the course *Basics of COVID-19*.
