Adolescents and teenagers are basically what we mean when we talk about children. The prevalence of substance misuse among children around the world is concerning. This troubling pattern may be influenced by elements including peer pressure, easy access to drugs and alcohol, and a desire to fit in. It is critical to address this issue right away because kids are starting to experiment with drugs at very young ages. Considering the negative impacts of substance misuse on children's mental health. Anxiety and sadness may be brought in by or made worse by substance addiction. The balance of neurotransmitters involved in mood regulation can get upset by the chemical changes in the brain brought by drugs or alcohol. Regular substance use can cause cognitive problems that undermine a child's capacity for clear thinking, good judgment, and academic success. Abuse of drugs or alcohol is strongly associated with a higher chance of acquiring mental illnesses such schizophrenia, bipolar disorder, and borderline personality disorder. As they frequently participate in risky behaviors that result in emotions of guilt and shame, children who abuse substances may experience low self-esteem and self-worth concerns. A child's isolation from their friends because of substance addiction might make them feel lonely and their mental health exacerbate.

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Prevention and Intervention:

Prevention and Intervention: Combating teen substance addiction necessitates a multifaceted strategy. Communities, schools, and parents should promote healthy coping techniques and educate people about the dangers of substance usage. Children need solid support networks made up of family, friends, and adults who can help them steer clear of substance misuse and towards a better lifestyle choice. Early detection of substance addiction and skilled assistance are essential in avoiding long-term mental health problems. Promoting Free and Open Communication is crucial to foster an atmosphere where kids feel free to express their worries and difficulties without fear of being judged.

In conclusion, youth substance addiction is a serious problem that negatively impacts their mental health. Our common duty is to inform, encourage, and steer our youth away from the dangers of substance usage. They will be able to enjoy happier, healthier lives as a result, and our communities will have a better future.



All the Faculty members and students were involved in a discussion of the various cyber threats with the alumni. The programme came to an end by 3.30 PM.



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
