- Teams may choose **any theme**, but it must be **appropriate and respectful** (no vulgarity, offensive symbols, or cultural insensitivity).
- Costumes must be ready before the event.
- Use of **eco-friendly materials** is encouraged.

3. Time Limit

- Each team will be allotted:
 - **2 minutes** for stage setup (if required)
 - **6–8 minutes** for performance
 - **1 minute** for exit

- Exceeding the time limit will result in negative marking.

4. Music Submission

- Teams must submit their **background track** in MP3 format at least **one hour before the event**.
- Music should be clean, free from explicit content.

5. Stage Rules

- **Props may be used**, but must be handled safely.
- No use of fire, water, smoke bombs, or hazardous items.
- The team is responsible for cleaning the stage after their performance.

6. Behaviour & Discipline

- Participants must maintain **decorum backstage and onstage**.
- Any form of misconduct or disrespect towards other teams may lead to disqualification.
- Decisions of the judges will be **final and binding**.

7. Judging Criteria

Performances will be evaluated based on: Theme interpretation, Costume creativity & design, Choreography and synchronisation, Stage presence & confidence, Overall impact

8. Registration

Teams must complete registration before the deadline announced by the organising committee.
